How to get to DWEB Camp Brazil

From São Paulo / São Paulo airports

By car

If you rent a car, the trip takes about 3 ½ hours, 250km. Otherwise you must take a public bus. Google maps indications are good all the way to Ubatuba. But once you're near the "Praia do Estaleiro" beach, don't follow the instructions through Almada: leave the BR-101 at the "Praia do Estaleiro" exit.



Turn left at the beach (yes you'll actually drive **on the beach sand**) keep going for 1 km and turn left again at Rua do Cemitério (Quioske do Jeremias is on the corner). If you reach a river you went too far, don't try to cross it.

The venue is 200m down the street.

Going by bus from São Paulo, first part: From São Paulo to Ubatuba

There is one daily bus directly from the international airport daily at 9:45am. The trip takes 4 hours and 10 minutes, so you should arrive around 2pm in the city of Ubatuba. It costs 82 BRL.

From the São Paulo bus station, there are about 7 different schedules. At the moment (July 2023) they leave at 6:45, 9:00, 11:30 am and 2, 4:30, 7 and 9pm. The trip takes 5 hours and 20 minutes and costs 108 BRL.

To get to the bus station from the international airport (GRU-Guarulhos), you can take a cab for 110-150 BRL, Uber, a bus (63 BRL, 40 minutes depending on traffic) or the subway (the airport station is connected by bus). To get to the bus station from the city airport (CGH-Congonhas), you can take a cab for 80-110 BRL, Uber or a city bus.

In both cases, *always check the schedule before*, and try to get the tickets in advance. The bus company website is https://app.passaromarron.com.br/. Unfortunately the site seems to be blocked from abroad, and there is no English version. Another option is to use a bus ticket aggregator site like https://www.buscaonibus.com.br/

Going by bus from São Paulo, second part: From Ubatuba to Instituto Neos

From the Ubatuba bus station, you must take a local bus or a cab to reach the venue. The taxi will cost 230-250 BRL. There are taxis on the station, and here is one reachable on whatsapp: Junior +55 12 99650-5117

There are two options to reach by bus. Both require some walking.

The first is a 1200 meters walk through car paths. Take any of the following city buses: Almada, Camburi, Divisa or Picinguaba Vila, and get down at km 15, the entrance to Praia do Estaleiro. Walk to the beach, turn left, walk until the Quiosque do Jeremias, turn left again (same as the car path above).

The second is a 300 meters walk through a footpath that can get slippery when wet. Take the city bus to Almada and ask to get down in front of the cemetery trail (trilha do cemitério). Follow the trail. The venue is after the cemetery, before the beach.



From Rio de Janeiro / Rio de Janeiro airports

If you rent a car, the trip takes about 4.1 / 2 hours, 290 km. Otherwise you must take a public bus. Google maps indications are good all the way to the border of São Paulo state. But once you're near the "Praia do Estaleiro" beach, don't follow the instructions through Almada: leave the BR-101 to the left at the "Praia do Estaleiro" exit, km 15.

Turn left at the beach (yes you'll actually drive **on the beach sand**) keep going for 1 km and turn left again at Rua do Cemitério (Quiosque do Jeremias is on the corner). If you reach a river you went too far, don't try to cross it.

The venue is 200m down the street.

Going by bus from Rio de Janeiro, straight:

Take a cab to the Rodoviaria Novo Rio (bus station). The regular cab costs 50-60 BRL, but there are other options like Uber:

From the bus station, there is a morning and a night bus to Ubatuba. The trip takes 5 ½ hours and costs 130 BRL. The night bus is not recommended; it will drop you around 3am and you'll still have a 20 min walk. Check tickets and schedule here: https://util.com.br/ Ask the driver to drop you at praia do Estaleiro, walk to the beach, turn left at the beach, walk to Quiosque do Jeremias, turn left again (same as the car path above). The venue is 200m down the street.

Going by bus from Rio de Janeiro, through Paraty:

From Rio, Paraty has many more daily buses than Ubatuba (and is worth visiting). 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours and 99 BRL. You can check the schedules here:

Again, there is no English version, but you can use an aggregator like https://www.buscaonibus.com.br/

From Paraty you can either hop on to an interstate bus passing by and get down at estaleiro entrance (check schedules at the bus station), or take a bus to Divisa (the state border) They go all the way to Almada. Ask to be dropped in front of the cemetery trail (trilha do cemitério). Follow the footpath. The venue is after the cemetery, before the beach. The trail is 300m long and may be slippery when wet.

You can also take a taxi from Paraty to the venue for around 220-250 BRL. Take them at the bus station or call Regis +55 24 99868-9775.



By boat :-)

Anchor in front of the small river in the south corner of Praia do Estaleiro, with a good distance from the beach which is shallow but with an excellent quality bottom and depth of about 3 to 4 m.

Anchoring waypoint: lat: 23° 20.940'S lon: 044° 53.255'W – it is possible to take a dinghy boat. At high tide, enter the little river and disembark directly at the venue.
